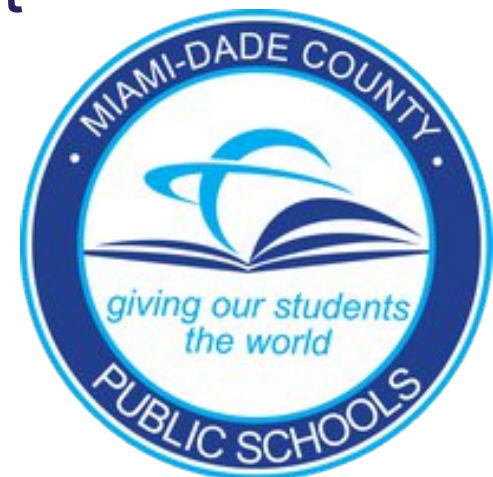
All About Title I (Cont'd.)

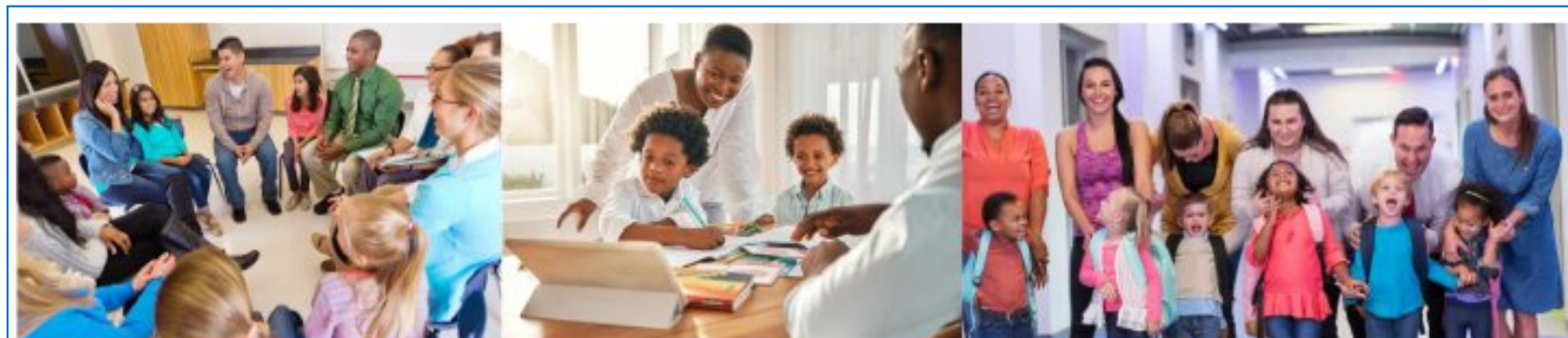

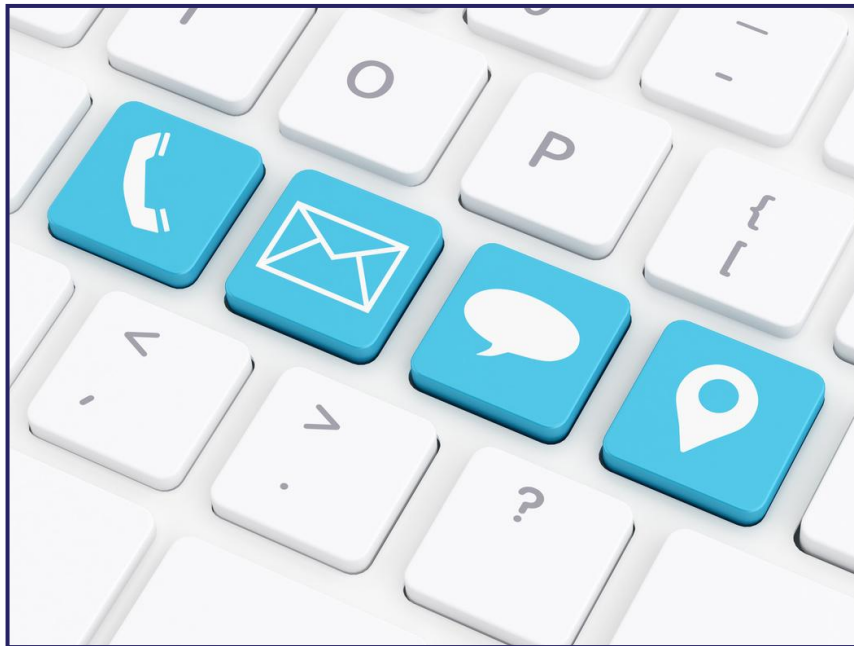

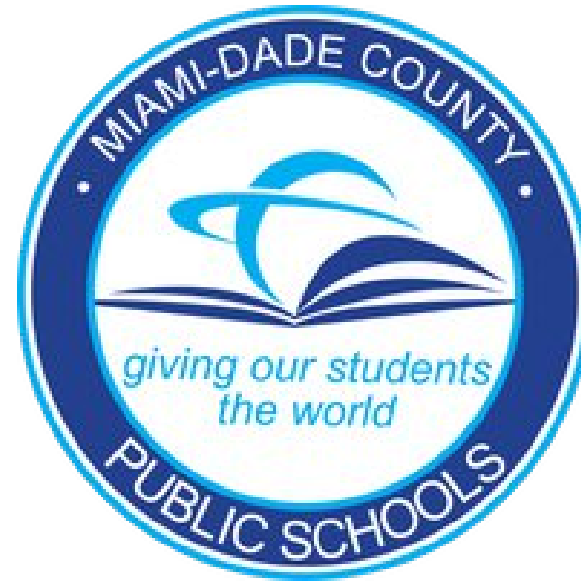
